The EQC

The Environmental Quality Commission (EQC) is a governmental body that advises the Crystal City Council on the conservation of environmental resources, including the study and proposal of possible environmental policies; and promotes public education and awareness relating to related environmental issues.

It also motivates interest in the proper use of and care for the city's natural resources.

Meetings are held the second Tuesday of each month at 7 p.m. at city hall.

Raingardens

Ornamental raingardens hold a few inches of rain. Build one in your yard to receive roof downspout and hard surface runoff.

Municipal raingardens (right) are built in the boulevard and hold some rainfall runoff, usually just a few inches. Additional runoff continues down the street. Gardens like this allow water to soak in, within a day at most. With enough raingardens, the community can improve the water quality in local streams, lakes and rivers.

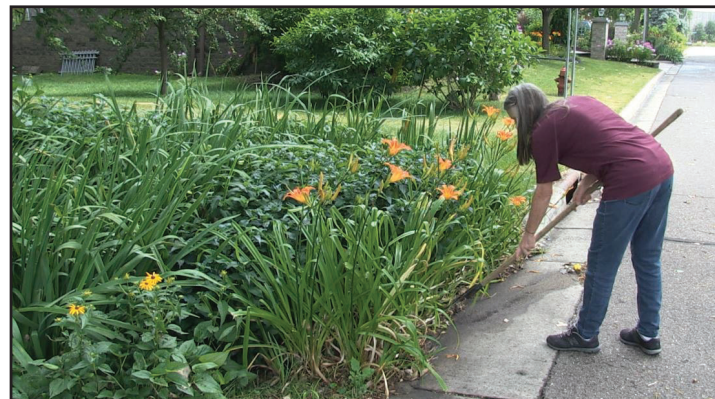
Gardening for Bees

Anyone with a garden – no matter the size – can help restore the bee population by creating a bee-friendly garden. Bees survive on flowers that supply them with food, nectar and pollen.

Types of local, bee-friendly garden plants:
