

- Place for 4-Square, Gaga Pit, etc.
- Small Picnic Shelter
- Community Garden




Facility Assessment Community Parks

Facilities that support use from outside the 'Neighborhood' should be located in a 'Community' Park.



Facility Assessment Playgrounds

- Crystal currently has 19 Playgrounds
 - One in each Neighborhood Park (13)
 - One in each Community Park (4)
 - One in each Destination Park (2)



- Statistically, Crystal needs 7 Playgrounds
- But, playgrounds should be within a ½ mile (10-minute walk) and not require pedestrians to cross an arterial road or 🔯
- Recommend the city have playgrounds in the same general locations as the existing 19 playgrounds



Facility Assessment Picnic Shelters

- Crystal currently has 1 Small Picnic Shelter (30 people)
 - Yunkers Park (1)
 - Some other parks have 'sun shelters'



- Recommend adding additional Small Picnic Shelters
 - Keep the one at Yunkers Park (1)
 - Add to other Neighborhood Parks
 - Upgrade existing 'sun shelters'
 - A great Neighborhood Park item





Facility Assessment Picnic Shelters

- Crystal currently has 4 Medium Picnic Shelters (50 people)
 - North Lions (1)
 - Bassett Creek (2)
 - Lions Valley Park (1)
- Recommend keeping all 4 Medium Picnic Shelters
 - North Lions (1)
 - Bassett Creek (2)
 - Lions Valley Park (1)

 All should be replaced over time





Facility Assessment Picnic Shelters

- Crystal currently has no Large Picnic Shelters (over 100 people)
- Recommend adding one Large Picnic Shelter
 - Bassett Creek (1)
 - Possibly incorporate restrooms into building





Facility Assessment Basketball

- Crystal currently has 14 full-sized and one ½ Court
 - Full-Court at many Neighborhood parks
 - Full-Court at all Community Parks
 - ½ Court (one basket) at one Neighborhood Park
- Statistically, Crystal should have 4 Basketball Courts
 - Full-court at all Community Parks (4)
 - Full-court at Becker Park (1)
 - Provide ½ Court (one basket) at Neighborhood Parks



Facility Assessment Soccer / Lacrosse

- Crystal currently has 2 Full-Sized 'Rectangle' Fields
 - Forest Park (1)
 - Lions Valley Place Park (1)

A Full-Sized Field is approximately 120 yards x 80 yards (2 acres)

- Statistically, Crystal should have 4 Full-Size Fields
 - North Lions Park (1) lighted (and maybe artificial turf)
 - Bassett Creek Park (2)
 - Forest Park (1)

Smaller fields also at Community and Neighborhood Parks



Facility Assessment Baseball

- Crystal currently has 5 Baseball Fields
 - Grogan Park (3) 2 of which are lighted
 - Bassett Creek Park (1)
 - North Lions Park (1)

Crystal Youth also use Smothers Field (MAC)

- Statistically, Crystal should have 4 Baseball Fields
 - Grogan Park (3) 2 lighted
 - Bassett Creek Park 1 lighted

May explore potential of lights at Smothers Field (MAC) instead



Facility Assessment Softball

- Crystal currently has 7 Softball Fields
 - Becker Park (2) both lighted
 - Welcome Park (3)
 - Lions Valley Place Park (1)
 - Bassett Creek Park (1)
- Statistically, Crystal should have 3 Softball Fields
 - Welcome Park (2) one lighted
 - Lions Valley Place Park (1)



Facility Assessment Tennis

- Crystal currently has 7 Tennis Courts (all lighted)
 - Lions Valley Place Park (3)
 - Becker (3)
 - North Lions Park (1)
- Statistically, Crystal should have 5 Tennis Courts (lighted)
 - Lions Valley Place (2) Tennis Complex (4-6)
 - Becker Park (2) or none
 - North Lions (1) none



Facility Assessment Pickleball

Crystal currently has no outdoor Pickleball Courts

Recommend adding Pickleball Courts (lighted)

• Lions Valley Place (2-4)

none

• Becker Park (2-4)

or

Pickleball Complex (6-8)

• North Lions Park (TBD)

none



Facility Assessment Disc Golf

- Crystal currently has 1 Disc Golf Course
 - Bassett Creek Park
 - Contains 15 Holes
- Recommend Disc Golf Course remain
 - Expand Course to 18 Holes



Facility Assessment Dog Park

- Crystal currently has 1 'Regular' Dog Park
 - Bassett Creek Park
- Recommend 'Regular' Dog Park remain
 - Bassett Creek Park
 - Move to more wooded area
 - Possibly add small dog area
- Summer dog parks could remain within hockey rinks



Facility Assessment Sledding Hills

- Crystal currently has 2 Sledding Hills
 - Lions Valley Place Park
 - North Lions Park
- Recommend keeping both Sledding Hills
 - Lions Valley Place Park
 - North Lions Park
 Recommend all sledding locations have heated buildings
 and be co-located with ice skating



Facility Assessment Ice Skating Rink

- Crystal currently has 5 Parks with Ice Skating
 - Lions Valley Place (Community Park)
 - Welcome (Community Park)
 - Broadway Park
 - Iron Horse Park
 - Twin Oak Park



Facility Assessment Ice Skating Rink

- Statistically, Crystal should have 2 Ice Skating Areas
 - Lions Valley Place (Community Park)
 - Welcome Park (Community Park)
 - Broadway Park remove
 - Iron Horse Park remove
 - Twin Oak Park remove
 - Add North Lions Park (Community Park) due to sledding Recommend all skating locations have heated buildings
- Becker Park could also have 'special' skating opportunity



Facility Assessment Heated 'Warming House' Buildings


- Crystal currently has 8 'Warming House' Buildings
 - Lions Valley Place (Community Park)
 - Welcome (Community Park)
 - North Lions (Community Park)
 - Bassett Creek (Community Park)
 - Broadway Park
 - Crystal Highlands Park
 - Forest Park
 - Twin Oak Park




Facility Assessment Heated 'Rentable' Community Buildings

- Recommend having 4 'Rentable' Community Buildings
 - Lions Valley Place (Community Park) *replace*
 - Welcome (Community Park) replace
 - North Lions (Community Park) replace
 - Bassett Creek (Community Park) replace
 - Broadway Park remove replace with a picnic shelter
 - Crystal Highlands Park remove replace with a picnic shelter
 - Twin Oak Park remove replace with a picnic shelter
 - Forest Park remove











North Lions Park Concept Plan CITY OF CRYSTAL










Facility Assessment Destination Parks

'Specialized' facilities that support use from both inside and outside Crystal should be located in a 'Destination' Park

- Features that provide a significant draw
- Hub of activity throughout the day all year long
- Can accommodate large community events & groups
- Accessible from light rail, bus, car, trail, etc.



Facility Assessment Performance Area



- Crystal currently has 1 Performance Area / Building
 - Located on edge/corner of park
 - Contains one large 'specialty' building with stage
- Recommend retaining a Performance Area
 - Improve location and type of performance area
 - Incorporate a covered area near the performance area
 - Flexible space for concerts as well as other community events
 - Great lawn would allow for picnics and impromptu activities



Facility Assessment Special Community Building

- Recommend replacing the 'Specialty' Building
 - Replace with a 4-Season Building with Restrooms
 - Uniquely designed to compliment other park features
 - Warming house in winter
 - Potential rentable space in summer
 - Potential Concession Stand and/or Skate Rental Area



Facility Assessment Destination Play Area

- Crystal currently has <u>no</u> destination play area
- Recommend adding a destination play area
 - Could be fully accessible to wheelchairs
 - Would be larger than other Crystal play areas
 - Could incorporate unique/artistic designs and features







Facility Assessment Water Feature




- Crystal currently has <u>no</u> 'non-pool' <u>water feature</u>
- Recommend adding a 'child-friendly' fountain
 - Located at Becker Park
 - Could be in multiple locations on site rather than one splash pad
 - Could be motion activated
 - Could have sections stay 'on'
 - Could include <u>colored lights</u> within fountain
 - Would provide white noise to dampen noise from road
 - Could be a way to bring artistic elements into the park



Facility Assessment Refrigerated Ice

- Crystal currently has <u>no</u> refrigerated ice
- Recommend adding a refrigerated ice sheet
 - Located at Becker Park
 - Would allow for skating 4-5 months of the year
 - Would be located on concrete in the central plaza
 - Would be a community gathering area in the summer
 - Could be covered with a fabric roof to keep sun off the ice and provide shade in the summer

- Community Gardens
- Citywide Trail System
- Neighborhood Park Amenities
- Volleyball / Bean Bag / Bocce Ball
- Potential New 'Non-Traditional' Activities
 - Sepak takraw
 - Tuj lub

 - Refine concept plans for the park
 - Present draft concept plans to PRC & City Council
 - Present draft plan to the public for additional input
- Prepare Final Master Plan Documents (June July)
